**WYTHEVILLE COMMUNITY COLLEGE**

The Twin County Community College Assistance Program will pay 50% of tuition and fees not covered by Federal or State Financial Aid or other major tuition scholarships for qualified Carroll County, Grayson County, and Galax City High School graduates to attend Wytheville Community College in a program from one of the following programs of study: General Education, College Transfer Programs, and Career and Technical Education programs. ### To qualify, you must:

- Provide proof of residence in Carroll County, Grayson County, or the City of Galax for at least the two years prior to graduation
  - Provide an official high school transcript
  - Have attended a public or private high school in Carroll County, Grayson County, or the City of Galax for at least your junior and senior years
- OR
- Have completed a GED by the graduation date of your original graduating class\*
- OR
- Have been a home-schooled student\*
- Have a minimum 3.0 high school GPA
  - Have graduated high school in 2020 or later

\*GED and home-schooled students are eligible for the program provided they meet WCC entrance requirements and other scholarship eligibility requirements

### To apply, you must:

- Complete an Application for Admission to Wytheville Community College; [apply.vccs.edu](http://apply.vccs.edu)
- Complete a current FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) form and have a completed financial aid file; [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov)
- Complete the WCC Scholarship Application and apply for other available scholarships or grants that may be available to the recipient, including those available through WCC: [www.wcc.vccs.edu/wcc-scholarship-application](http://www.wcc.vccs.edu/wcc-scholarship-application)

Qualified graduates must be enrolled in a program from one of the following programs of study: General Education, College Transfer Programs, and Career and Technical Education programs. A detailed list can be found at this link: [www.wcc.vccs.edu/programs](http://www.wcc.vccs.edu/programs)

### When you receive a scholarship, you must:

- Complete 10 hours of volunteer service each semester with an approved agency.
- Achieve a 2.0 grade point average by the end of the second semester and complete 67% of all attempted classes to continue receiving the scholarship for the second year.

Scholarships will be renewable contingent upon recipients meeting award criteria and upon availability of funding from the Twin County Community Foundation.
