



TWIN COUNTY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION COMMUNITY COLLEGE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM CLASS OF 2020

The Twin County Community Foundation Community College Assistance Program will pay 50% of tuition and fees not covered by Federal or State Aid or other major tuition scholarships. This program is for all qualified students who graduate from Galax, Grayson and Carroll County High Schools in the Class of 2020. The scholarship covers **5 out of 6** consecutive semesters after graduation: Summer 2020, Fall 2020, Spring 2021, Summer 2021, Fall 2021, and Spring 2022.

Qualified graduates must be enrolled in a program from one of the following programs of study: General Education, College Transfer Programs, and Career and Technical Education programs. A detailed list can be found at this link: www.wcc.vccs.edu/programs.

To qualify:

- You must have attended a public or private high school, in Galax, Grayson or Carroll County, during your junior and senior years
 - Home schooled students are also eligible, provided they meet WCC entrance requirements and satisfy all of the other eligibility requirements
 - Students who complete a GED by the graduation date of their original graduating class are eligible for the program, provided they satisfy the other eligibility requirements
 - Must have cumulative 3.0 grade point average in high school
- You must provide proof of residence in Galax, Grayson or Carroll County for at least the two years prior to graduation

To apply:

- Complete an Application for Admission to WCC
- Provide an official high school transcript by June 15, 2020. Please have your high school guidance counselor send it after graduation
- Complete a 2020-21 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) form and have a completed financial aid file
 - For Summer Semester 2020 only, complete a 2019-20 FAFSA
- Complete the WCC Scholarship Application
- Apply for any other available scholarships or grants, including those offered through the Wytheville Community College Foundation Office
- Enrolled in a program from one of the following programs of study: General Education, College Transfer Programs, and Career and Technical Education programs. A detailed list can be found at this link: www.wcc.vccs.edu/programs.

Important Information:

- The Twin County Community Foundation Community College Assistance Program will pay 50% of tuition and fees not covered by Federal or State Financial Aid or other major tuition scholarships.
- Books and supplies are **not** covered by the Twin County Community Foundation Community College Assistance Program.
- You are not automatically enrolled or accepted in the Twin County Community Foundation Community College Assistance Program when you apply for admission to the college or apply for financial aid.
- You must apply for the Twin County Community Foundation Community College Assistance Program separately through the WCC Foundation Office (Smyth Hall 146), or via the WCC Scholarship website.
- It is your responsibility to ensure that all required paperwork for the Twin County Community Foundation Community College Assistance Program is turned in or mailed to the WCC Foundation Office. It is not the responsibility of your high school, guidance counselor, or career coach.

To remain in the program you must:

- Complete 10 hours of volunteer service with an approved agency during **each** semester enrolled
- Achieve a 2.0 grade point average and complete 67% of all attempted classes, by the end of the second semester, to continue receiving the scholarship for the second year
